A bit about Ategi

Ategi is a registered charity delivering support services across Wales and England for over 30 years. From our head office in Pontypridd and satellite offices in Buckinghamshire and South Gloucestershire, we help adults live independent, fulfilling lives.



With around 80 employees and nearly 300 carers, our services include:



Shared Lives – matching adults with carers who support them in their own homes.



Supported Living – enabling people to live independently with the right support.



Community Support – helping people stay connected and engaged in their local area.

Our mission is simple:

Supporting people to live their best lives, their way.

What is Shared Lives?

Shared Lives is a bit like fostering, but for adults with support needs. Shared Lives carers share their home, family life, and community with someone who needs care and support — helping them live an independent, fulfilling life.



There are different ways Shared Lives carers provide support:



Long-term placements – welcoming someone to live with you as part of your family.



Short breaks / respite – offering temporary stays to give the person, or their usual carer, a break.



Shared Days – spending time together during the day, supporting activities and social inclusion.

Ategi recruits, trains, and supports self-employed Shared Lives carers who help individuals with everything from cooking and shopping to building confidence, accessing community activities, and living fulfilling, independent lives.

Shared Lives Panel Volunteers help make decisions about approving and supporting Shared Lives carers.

You'll read assessments, join friendly online panel meetings, and share your views to help us make fair, consistent decisions.

Time Commitment



- Around one morning per month or less, sometimes every other month
- Meetings run approximately 9:30 am 12:30 pm
- Remote all meetings are online

This flexible role fits easily around other commitments, studies, or part-time work.

Main Tasks



Read and review carer assessment documents and re-approval reviews.



Take part in panel discussions and share your views.



Help decide whether carers meet Ategi's standards.



Maintain confidentiality and follow our Code of Conduct.



Take part in training and stay up to date with relevant policies.
